



NEW RICHMOND REPUBLIC
CONGRESS OF PEOPLE'S COUNCILS

BE IT ENACTED by the elected delegates of the people's councils of the New Richmond Republic in Congress assembled during the second ordinary session of the third convocation thereof...

AN ACT

regarding the apportionment of delegates of the people's councils to the Fourth Congress

1. In accordance with article IV, section I, clause 2 of the Basic Law, the number of congressional delegates elected by each people's council is determined by law which strives to maintain proportionality in representation between them. To that end, the apportionment of delegates for the fourth convocation of the Congress of People's Councils is as follows:
 - a) the People's Council of the City of New Richmond will elect two delegates;
 - b) the People's Council of Fayette Commune will elect one delegate;
 - c) the People's Council of Northern Grove Commune will elect one delegate; and
 - d) the Soldier's Council will elect one delegate.
2. The apportionment of delegates prescribed herein may be altered by decree of the Central Executive Committee with the consent of the Chairperson of Congress, following consultation with any people's council(s) which would be affected by the proposed alteration.

Enacted by the Congress of People's Councils and thereafter promulgated by the People's Commissioner of the Republic on this Fourth day of December in the year two-thousand and twenty-two of the Common Era, and in the year of the Revolution the second.
