



NEW RICHMOND REPUBLIC CONGRESS OF PEOPLE'S COUNCILS

BE IT ENACTED by the delegates of the People's Councils of every city and commune in Congress assembled during the first ordinary session thereof...

AN ACT

to proclaim various national holidays of the Republic

1. There shall be various national holidays in the New Richmond Republic which shall commemorate historic events in the New Richmonder nation, days of cultural significance, days of commemoration, and other such days as determined by the Central People's Government.
2. The Central People's Government recognizes and proclaims the following national holidays:
 - a) New Year's Day (1st of January), in commemoration of the start of the new year.
 - b) Day of Freedom from Imperialism (11th of February), in commemoration of the secession of the New Virginian municipalities (including the City of New Richmond and the former Town of Augusta) from the Empire of Austenasia.
 - c) International Women's Day (8th of March), in honor of all women.
 - d) International Day of Workers (1st of May), in honor of the working class of the whole world.
 - e) Day of Victory over Fascism (9th of May), in honor of the victory of the Allied Forces over the fascist German Reich.
 - f) Day of the July Revolution (29th of July), in commemoration of the New Virginian July Revolution and the 29th of July Movement which preceded the formation of the Republic and the establishment of the Blair Mountain League.
 - g) Independence Day (2nd of August), in commemoration of the secession of the City of New Richmond from the Commonwealth of New Virginia to form the New Richmond Republic.
 - h) This section was superseded by resolution of Congress following the enactment of the Second Basic Law. Original text:
Day of the Basic Law (3rd of August), in commemoration of the enactment of the Basic Law of the New Richmond Republic.
 - i) New Richmond Day (16th of August), in commemoration of the establishment of the Dominion of New Richmond.
 - j) Day of Remembrance for the Battle of Blair Mountain (2nd of September), in commemoration of the heroic workers who sacrificed their lives in defense of the working class at the Battle of Blair Mountain in Logan County, West Virginia.
 - k) Day of Thanksgiving (fourth Thursday of November), a traditional holiday of the New Richmonder people.

- l) Transgender Day of Remembrance (20th of November), in commemoration of transgender people who have been murdered because of transphobia
- m) Christmas Day (25th of December), a traditional holiday of the New Richmonder people.

Enacted by the Congress of People's Councils and thereafter promulgated by the People's Commissioner of the Republic on this ninth day of August in the year two-thousand and twenty-one of the Common Era, and in the year of the Revolution the first.
