



NEW RICHMOND REPUBLIC  
**CONGRESS OF PEOPLE'S COUNCILS**

BE IT ENACTED by the elected delegates of the people's councils of the New Richmond Republic in Congress assembled during the second ordinary session of the third convocation thereof...

**AN ACT**

*to proclaim various national holidays of the Republic*

1. The 31st of January in every year is to be commemorated as a national holiday known as Mother Hewitt's Day, a festive day of celebration in honor of the eponymous founder of the Republic.
2. The 19th of February in every year is to be commemorated as a national holiday known as Flag Day, a festive day of celebration in honor of the adoption of the Mountain Standard as the national flag of the Republic.
3. The 9th of April in every year is to be commemorated as a national holiday known as Bourbon Day, a festive day of celebration in honor of the national alcoholic drink of the New Richmond Republic – Kentucky straight bourbon whiskey – and in particular honor of the curator of Kennedy's Bourbon Bar in New Richmond City, W. R. "Joe" Kennedy.
4. The 19th of May in every year is to be commemorated as a national holiday known as the Day of Remembrance for the Battle of Matewan, in celebration of the victory of Police Chief William Sidney "Smilin' Sid" Hatfield and the working people of Matewan, West Virginia over the Baldwin-Felts thugs, and in solemn honor and remembrance of Mayor Cabell Testerman, union miner Bob Mullins, and unarmed bystander Tot Tinsley, who all fell in that battle.
5. The 4th of August in every year is to be commemorated as a national holiday known as People's Commissioner's Day, a festive day of celebration in honor of those who have held the high office of People's Commissioner of the Republic and in particular honor of the first People's Commissioner, the respected comrade K. Riley Hewitt.
6. The traditional holiday of Halloween, celebrated annually on the 31st of October, is recognized as a national holiday.

*Enacted by the Congress of People's Councils and thereafter promulgated by the People's Commissioner of the Republic on this Fourth day of December in the year two-thousand and twenty-two of the Common Era, and in the year of the Revolution the second.*
